

The mission of the Purchase District is to discover, equip, connect and send lay and clergy leaders to join Christ's transforming, disciple-making work in and for the world.

The Calvert City Christmas Parade is a tradition that has been a kickoff to the Advent/Christmas celebrations in the community. The first parade took place in 1960 and the Calvert City Lions Club has been the organizers of the event since its beginnings. For many years, the staging area was the old Calvert City School campus and after it was destroyed by fire in 1968, floats lined up along Railroad Avenue then turned left on Main Street to Fifth Avenue. In recent years, the starting point has been the campus of Pathway Baptist Church.

More often than not, a float representing Calvert City United Methodist Church has been a part of the parade. This author will conclude a 25 year career in broadcasting at the end of 2019, seven of those years as the builder and operator of WCCK radio and 18 years in administration at WPSD television. One quickly learns in media that the old adage "you can please some of the people some of the time, but you can't please all of the people all of the time" rings true. In 1972, the float constructed by the Methodist Youth Fellowship generated quite a bit of controversy in the church after the parade was over.

The float that year was inspired by a Christmas card that had the symbols of six of the world's great religions: Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism, and Taoism. The message beneath the symbols was "One prayer, peace." With much effort by the MYF and Ernie Colburn, the symbols were replicated and placed on a hangar and beneath was the message as shown on the card. The float was well received and won a prize for its creativity.

After the parade, someone came up with the idea of hanging the symbols from the ceiling of the Fellowship Hall in the 1st and Main Street building. This was done and nothing was said until the next meeting of what was then called The Official Board.

At the end of the meeting, one member was clearly outraged about the display. This person had no issues with the symbols of the Abrahamic faiths (Christianity, Judaism, and Islam), but because of situations that had occurred between Christians and the adherents of the three non-Abrahamic religions, having their symbols placed in a church was equivalent to displaying a Swastika or Hammer and Sickle and called for the immediate removal of the display.

Perhaps it was in error that the overarching message should have been included with the display which was promptly removed from the building. Religion, politics, and society as a whole is much more polarized now than it was in 1972. However, this year let us seize upon the hope that was conveyed by that float – "one prayer, peace."

May this Advent and Christmas season be one of blessings and joy for each of you

Save & turn in your receipts

On November 17, we introduced an easy way to help people in need without depleting our benevolence funds. In short, this program could allow us to do more without spending more than current allocations. Many savings apps exist in your preferred app store. One we have begun using is called Fetch Rewards. Find out more at fetchrewards.com. Below is an explanation directly from their website:

Purchase Any Participating Product: "The easiest way to earn points with Fetch Rewards is to just shop for the products you already love. If you have any participating brands on your receipt, you'll get points based on the cost of the products. You don't need to clip any coupons or scan individual barcodes. Just scan each grocery receipt after you shop, and we'll find the savings for you. Special Offers are opportunities to earn bonus points on top of the regular points you earn every time you purchase a participating brand. Every time you refer someone, and they sign up with your unique referral code, you'll both get 2,000 bonus points when they complete their first receipt. Once you have accumulated enough points (as little as 3,000) redeem your Fetch Points for hundreds of different rewards in seconds".


Those of you who want to track your own rewards can download your app and redeem gift cards for personal use. On occasion, you may want to donate a small Wal-Mart or gas card to the church for benevolence needs. Those who find it easier to turn in your receipts can place them in the Fetch Rewards pail on the table in the narthex. One of our designated scanners will do the rest! Below are some guidelines for the greatest impact:

Brand names offer the greatest incentives, but almost every receipt from a major retailer counts as 25 points (even Aldi).

Turn in receipts from big box grocery stores, convenience stores, discount stores, pharmacies, or anywhere name brand purchases are made. Examples: Sam's Club, Dollar General, Wal-Mart, and CVS.

A maximum of 14 receipts can be uploaded in the most recent 7-day period, so if you want to be a designated church scanner, let the church office know. This will expand our collection and impact. Receipts turned in will be shredded for your protection, so make sure you no longer need them!

Thanks for helping us in this simple way. A little effort can go a long way!





Make some Christmas candles to remember Jesus, the Light of the world.



What you need:

- Unlined white notecards
- Hot glue (and adult help)
- Yellow tissue paper
- Mini muffin liners
- Clothespins

What you do:

- 1. Roll a notecard from side to side into a "candle" tube. Secure with glue.
- 2. Insert a piece of tissue paper "flame" in one end.
- 3. Glue the other end to a muffin liner. Then glue the liner to a clothespin.
- 4. Repeat to make many paper candles. Pin them to the branches of a Christmas tree.
