A few weeks ago, writing in The Lake News, Emily Morrison wrote, of complications related to the Ministerial Association's Veterans Fish Fry:

"Most places would have just thrown their hands up and cancel,... but not Calvert Citians. Can't is simply not an acceptable policy within, or near, the city limits. Calvert City is a city of doers."

Having lived here a little more than a month, I am impressed by how true this statement is, not just for the city, but for our church as well. We are busy, and not just busy for busyness's sake; we are busy for the Kingdom of

God. And we are not just busy, but are actually getting things done for the kingdom! In Matthew 24 and 25 we find several parables about strengthening the Kingdom of God. One of these is the parable of the Ten Talents. In it, Jesus teaches: <sup>14</sup> For it is as if a man, going on a journey, summoned his slaves and entrusted his property to them; <sup>15</sup> to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. <sup>16</sup> The one who had received the five talents went off at once and traded with them, and made five more talents." We are a five+five church in a five+five city. It is time for us to "go off at once and... make five more talents"!

And, as we return to action after COVID, it is logical to assume that we have new opportunities for missional expansion and strengthening that we need to act on. New ways to use what God has given us to turn a Kingdom profit! The world has been changed and hence we need to change with it. Frankly, however, I am not in a position to know what we need to change, how we need to adjust our budgeting, where our calendar is serving and where it is hindering the work of God, and what else we need to "rejoice in, reform, redeem, or reject."

So please help me out: let me know where you think CCUMC is doing a great job, where we need to better, what new things we might want to take on, and perhaps what things we need to move away from that we might put all that God has given us to its greatest use.

By the way, one way to communicate these things is through the Administrative Council, but feel free to contact me personally as well. Just be sure to let me know what you think we need to do to lean into being a five+five church!

Please keep our patrons and our ministry in your prayers.



NBC news personality Tom Brokaw gave an appropriate designation to a special group of people. "The Greatest Generation" dealt with the hardships of the Great Depression and many went on to serve the United States in World War II which preserved our civilization from ruin. Calvert City Methodist Church has said goodbye to its last member that was a veteran of that conflict.

Billie Joe Strader grew up in rural Calloway County graduating from the former Hazel High School, and upon completion of military service came to Calvert City in the second influx of new residents that relocated to the community to work in the industrial complex. Bill worked in purchasing/procurement at both National Carbide and Pennwalt. Bill and his wife Betty became active in both the community and church. Upon taking his retirement, Bill began a very challenging project with his key role in the construction of the current church building.

The first influx of new residents associated with the construction of Kentucky Dam created the need for the congregation to replace its original building in 1944. With the first chemical plant locating on the Tennessee River in 1949, more growth occurred and the brick sanctuary was constructed at 1st and Main followed by an educational annex in 1955. In the 1960's, it was becoming apparent that the facility was landlocked and parking and steps made the building to become functionally obsolete. The situation worsened when the facility was struck by lightning on Sunday, April 25th, 1965.

Bill applied both his expertise in finance and construction in playing a leading role in the construction of the 5th and Oak Park church building in 1991. The facility has served the congregation and community well for 30 years and will continue to do so for many more. Many of the wooden fixtures in the facility were created by Bill and his brother, Orvis. Also, three generations of the Strader family are integral parts of the life and ministry of the Methodist people of this community, so Bill's presence extends well beyond the walls he helped put in place.

As these special people now pass beyond out sight into the pages of history, let us all be grateful for them taking a stand to preserve our freedom as a nation and world and what so many did to make our community and its institutions great
