In light of increased transmission of Covid-19, we do still plan to travel to Florida, but promise to our congregation to be

extremely selective regarding any activities we might consider. ### SAVE YOUR ALUMINUM CANS & SMART SHOPPERS STAMPS!!

Are you aware that every Tuesday is double stamps at Food Giant. Thank you to all who save the stamps for our Food Pantry. Please continue to save your Food Giant Smart Shoppers stamps and place them in the glass jar in the Narthex. The church received a \$100 check from the stamps in July.

Please continue to recycle your aluminum cans! All money from recycling of the cans is also placed in the Food Pantry fund. Please deposit your cans in the large black garbage can in the Fellowship Hall (tagged Can Recycling) or place your bag next to the can.

Continue saving your pennies too! Jackson Boone is collecting them, please just place them in the jars on the table in the Narthex.

Receipts from the most previous 14 days from grocery, discount, or convenience stores can be placed in the Fetch Rewards bucket in the Narthex.

#### Face Coverings for in Person worship:

A question has been raised if face shields are a suitable alternative to wearing masks in worship. According to the CDC, "It is not known if face shields provide any benefit as source control to protect others from the spray of respiratory particles. CDC does not recommend use of face shields for normal everyday activities or as a substitute for cloth face coverings." Nevertheless, with input from health care personnel and the indoor worship planning team, Calvert City UMC will permit the wearing of face shields in lieu of other face coverings on a case by case basis. This policy shall be considered a temporary exception subject to change as more information is learned about the transmission of Covid-19. Anyone who desires to substitute a mask for a face shield is asked to make that request by contacting the church office. Approved shield wearers should also socially distance as much as twelve feet instead of the standard six feet and observe other recommended CDC guidelines concerning face shields: https:// www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-gettingsick/cloth-face-cover-quidance.html.

#### "Victory in Jesus"

Eugene Monroe Bartlett, Sr. is considered one of the founding fathers of Southern Gospel Music. During his career he traveled the south teaching churches and musicians how to sing. He founded the Hartford Music Publishing Company with the

mission of publishing hymns and teaching singers to read music. All while composing over 800 hymns of his

his all changed when he suffered a stroke in 1939 that left him paralyzed and bedridden for the last 2 years of his life. Amid such bleak circumstances, he wrote his final and most beloved song, "Victory in Jesus", an optimistic number that has been sung by millions in worship services and recorded by gospel's biggest names. The three verses and refrain enthusiastically tell of one's own personal salvation experience from beginning to end. It's said that Bartlett missed traveling and teaching, but he could still study the Bible, a study from which he gave us this wonderful song during a time when much of the earth sat on the brink of World War II.

"We hope to get back to singing soon. There is some promising research coming out that might allow for singing with a mask. But until then, we must continue to "do no harm", and not sing during in person worship services."

The COVID-19 has caused disruptions in so many facets of day to day lives. The Methodist Annual Conference is no exception and instead of the usual time on or near Pentecost Sunday, a wide variety of dates have been selected for 2020 and the Memphis Annual Conference will be utilizing a virtual format for the first time.

This will be the first time that the Memphis Conference has met for its regular session in the Fall of the year since the 1940's. The later time in the year had been utilized because of the number of church members that were engaged in agricultural related jobs and that they depended on the income derived from the sale of the crops to make the contributions necessary for their churches to pay their apportionments.

Over time as the base of the regional economy became less depended on farming, the idea was floated to move the date of Annual Conference to just after the end of the school year to make things easier for the children of ministers that were to move to transition to a new school setting. Rev. Ted Hightower, one of the more colorful ministers to serve in the Methodist Church in Kentucky was one of the leading advocates of the change.

So the old saying "what's old becomes new again" and in this unsettling time, the Methodist Conference will definitely be "back to the future" in 2021.

#### What you need:


- Masking tape
