
The next Administrative Council meeting will take place on Sunday, May  $16^{\rm th}$  @ 6:00 pm.



Summer plans are being finalized and will be sent out soon. We are looking to a fun somewhat normal summer! Finish the year strong!


Graduate Sunday is May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Youth will meet through May 12 and then we will take a few weeks off and start summer family fun nights in June!






Please join us for Graduate Sunday on May 2<sup>nd</sup>!

To have lived 100 years is quite an achievement. But what is the probability of someone making it to 110 and becoming a supercentenarian?? Only one out of one thousand centenarians enjoy such a long life span. On Thursday, May 6, 2021, one of our own at Calvert City Methodist Church will become part of that very special group of people.

Paul and Evelyn Porter Harrington were part of the entertainment industry. Paul learned his craft working his way from an entry level popcorn machine operator to becoming a projectionist. He had worked for the Ruffin Amusement Company before the Newbern, Tennessee, natives moved to Calvert City in 1949 and purchased the town theater from Shelby McCallum (who went on to establish radio station WCBL in 1954). The Harringtons operated the theater which was located on the west side of Main Street between Railroad Avenue and First Avenue.

America was in a boom period following the end of World War II and auto manufacturers could sell their products as fast as they could be produced. The trend of "drive in" convenience spread through many industries including theaters. The Harringtons decided to seize the opportunity and in early 1953 purchased ten acres of property from Mrs. Dora Draffen just south of Calvert City. The Calvert Drive-In opened on July 3, 1953 with admissions prices of 35 cents. The traditional theater was closed and the family donated many of the seats from the facility to the church and they were utilized in the choir area and MYF room in the First and Main Street church building until its closing. Seats were also donated to the Calvert City Masonic Lodge and continue to be utilized in that facility.

While the number of Drive-In theaters has decreased from a maximum of over 5000 nationwide to only about 300 today with 14 of those in Kentucky, the Harrington family's operation has stood the test of time. Ms. Evelyn perfected the art of preparing cheeseburgers and it would be a challenge to find a local resident who has not enjoyed one at some point in time.

The family included four sons and two daughters and now includes many grandchildren and greats. Mr. Harrington passed away in 1984 and his family has continued to successfully operate this iconic business. Mrs. Harrington's grandson John now oversees the operation. The theater has survived in spite of changing entertainment options, the construction of Interstate 24, and the transition to digital projection systems.

One trait of supercentenarians is being free of major diseases and healthy and active lifestyle. Ms. Evelyn has certainly succeeded and has been blessed with such a long life and in turn has blessed so many others.



Jesus commands us to be his witnesses. This craft is a reminder to reach out to all our "circles."


### What you need:
